You are kindly requested to advise all incoming Ship Masters if their ships visited a Chinese ports in the last 30 days, must provide the below to Harbour Master along with the 72 hours ETA notice:

1) Attached Declaration of Health

- 2) A statement by the Master that Crew Members onboard are free from any symptoms that include high fever, sore throat, persistent coughing, breathing difficulties and other symptoms that may indicate infection with the new Coronavirus.
- 3) Are any new Coronavirus cases suspected onboard or not?

All vessels which have visited any ports in China in the last 30 days will be directed by the Harbour Master to special anchorage, and Port Health, Ministry of Health will be informed. Vessel can only be berthed after clearance by Port-Health.

CIRCULAR No. (1) /2020 تعميم رقم (1) لسنة 2020

NOVEL CORONAVIRUS ALERT

To:

- 1. All Marine Agencies,
- 2. All Kuwait Ports,
- 3. Owners and Operators of all Kuwaiti Ship.

As part of the efforts to take all precautions and measures to prevent the spread of the new Coronavirus from ships calling Kuwait, All ports must ensure any ship visited a Chinese ports in the last 30 days must provide, and at least three days before her arrival to the first port of call in Kuwait, a statement by the master that crew members onboard are free from any symptoms that include high fever, sore throat, persistent coughing and breathing difficulties and other symptoms that may indicate infection with the new Coronavirus.

If the new Coronavirus is suspected on the crew onboard, the port should inform the health-port, Ministry of Health before allowing the ship to enter the port and wait further instructions. لغاية

في إطارالجهود الرامية إلى كافة الاحتياطات والإجراءات لمنع إنتشار فيروس كورونا الجديد عبر المنافذ الحدودية البحرية والموانئ، يجب على جميع الموانئ الدولة التأكد من أن السفن التي زارت أحد الموانئ الصينية في آخر 30 يوم قد قامت وقبل وصولها أول ميناء في الدولة بثلاث أيام على الأقل، بتقديم بيان من ريان السفينة بخلو أفراد الطاقم من أي أعراض مرضية تشمل ارتفاع الحرارة، إلتهاء الحلق، السعال المستمروص وبات في المتنفس وغيرها من الأعراض التي قد تشيرالي الإصابة بعدوى قيروس كورونا الجديد.

في حالة الاشتباه بأي من أعراض فيروس كورونا الجديد على أحد أفراد الطاقم، يجب على المو انئ إبلاغ صحة الموانئ-وزارة الصحة قبل السماح للسفينة بدخول الميناء وإنتظار تعليماتها.

Novel Coronavirus (2019-nCoV)

Introduction

The purpose of this circular is to provide information and guidance, based on recommendations developed by the World Health Organization (WHO), on the precautions to be taken to minimize risks to seafarers, passengers and others on board ships from novel coronavirus (2019-nCoV).

Background

- On 31 December 2019, WHO was alerted to several cases of pneumonia in Wuhan City, Hubei Province of China. Subsequently, on 7 January 2020, Chinese authorities confirmed that they had identified a new virus in the coronavirus family of viruses, which includes the common cold and viruses such as SARS and MERS. This new virus was temporarily named "2019-nCoV".
- WHO has been working with the Chinese authorities, governments and global experts to rapidly expand scientific knowledge on the new virus, track its spread and virulence, and provide advice on measures to protect health and prevent the spread of this outbreak.
- As of 29 January 2020, a total of 130 tests have been concluded in the United Kingdom, all of which were confirmed negative. The latest information regarding the situation in the United Kingdom can be obtained at the following address:

On 30 January 2020, WHO declared that the outbreak of novel coronavirus (2019-nCoV) constituted a Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC).

Symptoms

Common signs of infection include respiratory symptoms, fever, cough, shortness of breath and breathing difficulties. In more severe cases, infection can cause pneumonia, severe acute respiratory syndrome, kidney failure and even death. Infection from humans to humans may occur during the incubation period (before persons show signs of sickness). Coronavirus can cause more severe symptoms in people with weakened immune systems, older people, and those with long-term conditions like diabetes, cancer and chronic lung disease.

Risks

The current outbreak originated in Wuhan City, which is a major domestic and international transport hub. Given the large population movements and the observed human-to-human transmission, it is not unexpected that new confirmed cases will continue to appear in other areas and countries.

WHO advice

- It is prudent to remind populations and health workers of the basic principles to reduce the general risk of transmission of acute respiratory infections by following the below-mentioned key preventative measures:
 - avoiding close contact with people suffering from acute respiratory infections; .1
 - frequent handwashing, especially after direct contact with ill people or their .2 environment;
 - avoiding unprotected contact with farm or wild animals; .3
 - people with symptoms of acute respiratory infection should practise cough .4 etiquette (maintain distance, cover coughs and sneezes with disposable tissues or clothing, and wash hands); and
 - within healthcare facilities, enhance standard infection prevention and .5 control practices in hospitals, especially in emergency departments.
- WHO does not recommend any specific health measures for travellers. In case of symptoms suggestive of acute respiratory illness either during or after travel, travellers are encouraged to seek medical attention and share their travel history with their healthcare provider. Health authorities should work with travel, transport and tourism sectors to provide travellers with information to reduce the general risk of acute respiratory infections via travel health clinics, travel agencies, conveyance operators and at points of entry.
- Travellers who had contact with confirmed cases or direct exposure to a potential source of infection should be placed under medical observation. High-risk contacts should avoid travel for the duration of the incubation period (up to 14 days).
- Novel coronavirus (2019-nCoV) advice for the public published on the WHO website contains WHO standard recommendations for the general public to reduce exposure to and transmission of a range of illnesses, to protect yourself and others from getting sick, and to stay healthy while travelling. - With the information currently available for the novel coronavirus, WHO advises that measures to limit the risk of exportation or importation of the disease should be implemented, without unnecessary restrictions on international traffic.
- Member States are advised to urge all stakeholders (companies, managers, crewing agents, etc.) to promulgate information to ensure that seafarers, passengers and others on board ships are provided with accurate and relevant information on the coronavirus outbreak and on the measures to reduce the risk of exposure if they are likely to be engaged on ships trading to and from ports in coronavirus-affected States.
