MSRC to Provide CASP for SB Transits of the Santa

Barbara Channel

ECM's Client Alert 33-2015 issued on December 3, 2015 and then updated with Client Alert 22-2016 advised that as of January 1, 2016 **MARINE SPILL RESPONSE CORPORATION (MSRC)** would no longer provide enhanced California Shoreline Protection (CASP) coverage for vessels—tank or nontank - transiting the southbound traffic lanes of the Santa Barbara Channel and /or that operated in Port Hueneme.

On July 10, 2017 MSRC issued an announcement stating that effective July 1st they are providing CASP to vessels —tank or nontank - transiting the southbound traffic lanes of the Santa Barbara Channel. This coverage will be provided at no additional charge for owners/operators who are enrolled with MSRC for primary OSRO services with the following provisions.

- 1. MSRC's coverage is only for southbound transits of the Santa Barbara Channel.
- 2. Vessels covered by MSRC that call Port Hueneme will still require CASP coverage from the **National Response Corporation (NRC)**.
- 3. The coverage is provided free of charge to **MSRC** covered vessels.
- 4. Prior notification to MSRC is **not** required to receive the coverage.

Since **NRC** was the sole provider of CASP services from January 1, 2016 – July 1, 2017, many owners/operators contracted with **MSRC** entered into **CASP Only** coverage contracts with **NRC**. Those contracts will still be required for vessels operating in Port Hueneme.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

MSRC clients with vessels transiting the southbound traffic lanes of the Santa Barbara Channel do not need to take any action as your vessels will be covered automatically.

MSRC clients who signed a short form contract with NRC for CASP should instruct their masters to only send the "NRC AUTHORIZATION TO PROCEED California Shoreline Protection and/or Santa Barbara Channel Transit" form to **NRC** when calling Port Hueneme.

ECM has contacted **NRC** to see if this will now change their fees for CASP coverage in the Santa Barbara Channel. We have not yet had their reply.
